ACADEMIC PROGRAM



SKKU WISE offers knowledge specific to Korea in business, culture, science and technology, presented by industry experts. The program consists of a 3-week session conducted in English, mixing together Korean students with international students. Courses meet every morning and afternoon, Monday to Friday, for three hours apiece.

COURSE DESCRIPTION



Seminar on Korean Business in an International Context

Today, South Korea boasts the world's 12th largest economy. Large corporations such as Samsung, Hyundai, and LG are dominating global markets. What's even more amazing is that just 60 years ago, this was the most impoverished country on Earth. How was this transformation made possible?

This course explores the characteristics of Korea's largest corporations, known as chaebols. What is it about their organizational structure and history that has led to their global domination? What are some of the challenges they've faced in globalizing, and what are the big successes and failures? Also, what are the social and demographic factors that influence Korea's corporate culture, and how are they changing? This course focuses on these and other issues, challenging students to develop business strategies for the future. Guest lecturers from major Korean corporations such as Samsung will share their experiences. This course is intended for students with a background in business, economics or related fields.

Smart Phones: The Great Leap towards Ubiquitous Computing

Just as the Internet changed the world at the turn of the century, now smartphones are powering a new paradigm of mobile technology. Today, average users spend more time on their smartphones than computers. South Korea, as the world's foremost adopter of cutting-edge technology, plays host to the technology ecosystem of the future. With its advanced communications infrastructure, the country is a playground for new electronic gadgets. What lessons can we learn from this technological environment, and how can they be applied to the smartphone industry? Where are we heading with this new smart device revolution, and how will it shape global society and the economy?

This course focuses on the technological side of smartphones, from the macro level of data networks all the way down to the micro level of smart phone applications. Senior researchers from Samsung Electronics and SKKU will share their insights and guide student projects for developing mobile applications. This course is intended for science and engineering students or students from other majors who have an interest in technology.



Korean Culture and Society: A Regional and Global Perspective

Korea has a long history of absorbing foreign cultures, adapting them, and reproducing them as a uniquely Korean product. Starting with the long tradition of cultural exchange between China, Korea and Japan, to the modern rise of K-pop and K-dramas, this course explores how Korea's unique cultural products are packaged to reach global audiences and places them in a social context. Often this is done with government funding as part of a strategy to build Korea's "soft power." Every aspect of Korean cultural products has been promoted under a careful strategy – from K-pop and dramas to film and rock music, from food and medical tourism to art and literature – and consumers around the world have responded in their own unique ways.

This course looks at the unique challenges of these cultural sectors and the strategies they employ for success. K-pop is growing in popularity around the world, but how effective is it in raising awareness of Korea? Despite government efforts to promote royal Joseon food, Americans have embraced their own creation: the Korean taco. Currently, the Korean literature community is grappling with how to win a Nobel Prize for their country. What kind of distinctive brand do all of these elements create for Korea? This course is open to all students interested in contemporary Asia.

Intensive Korean Language


This course is appropriate to learn basic Korean language and experience Korea as well within three weeks. Students are assigned to the level that best suits their proficiency, according to their placement test, including interview and written test.

RECOMMENDED CREDITS

Each course is 45 hours long. SKKU awards 3 credits for each class, with a total of 6 credits for the full program. Credits may be weighted differently for different home universities.



WINTER IN KOREA



Climate

Koreans take much pride in the four distinct seasons of their country. From December to early March, Korea is transformed into a snowy wonderland. With temperatures in Seoul falling between -10 to +5 Celsius, it is recommended that everyone bring winter clothes, especially a winter coat, sweaters, and hat, as well as good shoes for snow, gloves, and scarf. There are many winter activities around Seoul including ice skating, snow sledding, and outdoor concerts. East of Seoul, in the mountainous province of Gangwon-do, there is heavy snowfall and temperatures may drop into the -20s. That is where you will find Korea's best winter attractions: its ski resorts, hot springs, and various winter festivals where you can try ice fishing, go sledding, or enjoy majestic snow and ice sculptures. In 2018, the Winter Olympics will be hosted in Pyeongchang, Gangwon-do, and preparations for the games are well underway. Experience warm comfort in chilly Korea in 2015!

Extracurricular Activities

Visiting Korea in the winter offers many opportunities to enjoy seasonal activities in the snow. Extracurricular activities focus on cultural experiences, visits to companies and historic sites, and opportunities to experience the best of Korea's winter season. Take a special scenic train ride through the snow-capped mountain range of Gangwon Province to the city of Taebaek, host of the Taebaek Mountain Snow Festival.
